FROM THE DESK OF FATHER HAGE

Father Carey and I will be prepared to hear Confessions for an extended period this Monday, March 29 from 4pm until 7pm at St. Joan of Arc in Morrisville for the entire PCA. I will expose the Blessed Sacrament on the altar at 4pm, so parishioners can also adore the Blessed Sacrament while they wait in line to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. I will do Solemn Benediction at 7pm to conclude this special offering. Please take advantage of this unique opportunity to receive God's mercy this year. I wanted to share with you a simple step-by-step guide on how to go to confession. I found this guide in the National Catholic Register and I thought it was very helpful. Again, if it has been a while, any priest will be happy to walk you through your confession from beginning to end. A How-To Guide on Confession:

- 1.) After the priest greets you in the name of Christ, make the sign of the cross. He may choose to recite a reading from Scripture, after which you say: “Bless me Father for I have sinned. It has been (state how long) since my last confession. These are my sins.”
 - 2.) Tell your sins simply and honestly to the priest. You might even want to discuss the circumstances and the root causes of your sins and ask the priest for advice or direction.
 - 3.) Listen to the advice the priest gives you and accept the penance from him. Then make an Act of Contrition for your sins.
 - 4.) The priest will then dismiss you with the words of praise: “Give thanks to the Lord for He is good.” You respond: “For His mercy endures forever.” The priest will then conclude with: “The Lord has freed you from your sins. Go in peace.” And you respond by saying: “Thanks be to God.”
 - 5.) Spend some time with Our Lord thanking and praising Him for the gift of His mercy. Try to perform your penance as soon as possible.
