### **St. Jean Marie Baptiste Vianney - Patron Saint of Parish Priests**

Feast Day- August 4  
Born to poor peasants near Lyons, France, he grew up during the French Revolution, studying his catechism in secret as priests and faithful were risking death and torture for their faith. Their courage inspired his deep love for Jesus and the cross. Overcoming obstacles to become a priest in 1815, he later became the Cure of Ars, a very small town in France. His deep devotion and challenging teaching drew many to him and the sacraments, eventually transforming the whole town of Ars. He was beatified in 1925 by Pope Pius XI and in 1928 declared patron of the world's parish priests.

His priesthood and the mass was everything to him, and to those who attended it was clear that he was "fulfilling of

Sacrifice of Christ on the cross". A peasant from Macron when asked, "Who did you see at Ars?" answered, "I saw God, in a man." More at:
