FROM THE DESK OF FATHER HAGE

We welcome David Pasinski at all Masses this weekend. He is our assigned speaker for the annual Pontifical Missions appeal. David is speaking on behalf of Unity Acres, which is a House of Hospitality for men. Their mission is to provide a safe, caring and permanent home for men, and particularly those who have become chronically homeless due to alcohol or substance abuse, or other factors. When first opened in 1969, Unity Acres was envisioned by its founder, Father Raymond McVey, as a place of refuge for homeless men in Central New York and beyond. For 50 years, people of faith and our residents have together put into practice the works of mercy: feeding the hungry, welcoming the stranger, clothing the naked, caring for the sick, burying the dead, etc. And Unity Acres has become a sign of hope for the men, as well as for those who have assisted in keeping Father Ray’s dream alive. Thirty men are currently living at the Acres. Despite their individual troubles, the men create and maintain a serene atmosphere at the Acres. They assist one another in the many tasks necessary to create a sense of safety, sobriety and community, sharing in the work of preparing meals, doing laundry, yard work, gardening, maintenance, and the many other activities which allow Unity Acres to function and flourish. St. Jean Marie Baptiste Vianney - Patron Saint of Parish Priests

Feast Day- August 4

Born to poor peasants near Lyons, France, he grew up during the French Revolution, studying his catechism in secret as priests and faithful were risking death and torture for their faith. Their courage inspired his deep love for Jesus and the cross. Overcoming obstacles to become a priest in 1815, he later became the Cure of Ars, a very small town in France. His deep devotion and challenging teaching drew many to him and the sacraments, eventually transforming the whole town of Ars. He was beatified in 1925 by Pope Pius XI and in 1928 declared patron of the world’s parish priests.

His priesthood and the mass was everything to him, and to those who attended it was clear that he was “fulfilling of Sacrifice of Christ on the cross”. A peasant from Macron when asked, “Who did you see at Ars?” answered, “I saw God, in a man.” More at:
