FROM THE DESK OF FATHER HAGE

I would like to encourage all of our parishioners to consider giving to this year’s HOPE Appeal. If we all give, we will easily meet our 2021 HOPE Appeal goal, which is our parish share of the support for HOPE Appeal-funded ministries, programs, and services. If we exceed our 2021 Hope Appeal Goal, 100 percent of the excess will be returned directly to our parish. *In an effort to meet our goal, I am asking every family in the parish to consider a minimum gift of \$95.00 (averages out to \$0.26 a day or \$7.92 a month). I have already personally given this suggested amount (times four) for each parish to show my support for this drive.* If you are able to contribute more, I strongly encourage you to do so. If you are not able to make the minimum gift, please give what you can. Your gift, no matter the size, whether it is a pledge or a one-time gift, is so important.
