FROM THE DESK OF FATHER HAGE

For nearly a half century, the Catholic Church in the United States has celebrated National Migration Week the second week of January, which is an opportunity for the Church to reflect on the circumstances confronting migrants, including immigrants, refugees, children, and victims and survivors of human trafficking. The theme for National Migration Week 2020, "Promoting a Church and a World for All," draws attention to the fact that each of our families have a migration story, some recent and others in the distant past. Regardless of where we are and where we came from, we remain part of the human family and are called to live in solidarity with one another. Unfortunately, in our contemporary culture we often fail to encounter migrants as persons, and instead look at them as unknown others, if we even notice them at all. We do not take the time to engage migrants in a meaningful way, as fellow children of God, but remain aloof to their presence and suspicious or fearful of them. During this National Migration Week, let us all take the opportunity to engage migrants as community members, neighbors, and friends. To do so, please make an effort to become aware of local initiatives that are making important contributions in this regard.

New Parish Bible Study!

The next parish Bible Study will take place on Tuesday, January 21. We will meet on a monthly basis every 3rd Tuesday of the month, from 6:30-8PM. In *The Eucharist in Scripture*, discover God's plan as it is expressed through the Bible and the Mass. This 6-lesson study, presented by Dr. Scott Hahn, will unlock the meaning of covenant, sacrifice, and sacrament as understood in the Bible, from Genesis through Revelation. It is built around 3 of Dr. Hahn's foundational talks: "The Lamb's Supper," "The Fourth Cup," and Consuming the Word." *The Eucharist in Scripture* examines the Church's liturgy as the original context for the books of the Bible.
