HOPE Appeal

Thank you to all who have contributed so far to this year's HOPE Appeal. Please remember, it's not how much you give, but that everyone gives what they can to help support the efforts of the diocese in providing services for the over 240,000 Catholics in our seven-county diocese. As always, thank you for your generous support of your parishes and the Diocese of Syracuse.



FROM THE DESK OF FATHER HAGE

I would like to give both of our communities an update on the current status of our HOPE Appeal goals. This year's HOPE Appeal goal for St. Joan's in Morrisville is \$6,412, and so far \$2,190 has been raised by 15 of 58 registered households. Just by way of reminder, in order to reach the HOPE Appeal goal for St. Joan's, all St. Joan's families have been asked to consider a gift of \$108.00, which averages out to \$9 a month. This year's HOPE Appeal goal for St. Mary's in Hamilton is \$14,711, and so far \$7,446 has been raised by 37 of 161 registered households. Just by way of reminder, in order to reach the HOPE Appeal goal for St. Mary's, all St. Mary's families have been asked to consider a gift of \$96.00, which averages out to \$8 a month. The reason why I want to bring this to everyone's attention is that if we do not meet our HOPE Appeal goals, these goals will turn into bad debt with the diocese that carries over from year to year. If everyone chips in and works together, we can easily accomplish what is being asked of us. Know that I would never ask you to give what I myself I am not willing to give, so I have personally donated enough money to cover the cost of four households from our parishes. If you can't make the suggested offering, please know that every gift counts! It doesn't matter how big or small the gift, it just matters that we are all doing this together as one community united in charity. Thank you to those who have already given. I am deeply grateful for your contribution.

Disposing of Religious Artifacts

As Catholics, we are accustomed to having religious objects "blessed," which signifies the permanent sanctification and dedication of an object for some sacred purpose. Once a religious object is blessed and dedicated for divine worship or veneration, it must be treated with reverence and must not be used in either an improper or profane way (cf. Code of Canon Law, #1171).

What happens when the rosary or statue breaks and is irreparable? Or, when the palm dries out, and the following Palm Sunday provides us with new palm? The basic rule for the disposition of these items is to burn or to bury them.

So, instead of dropping it off in the church basement, the normal "rule of thumb" is that anything that has been blessed should be burned (and then the ashes buried) or simply buried.

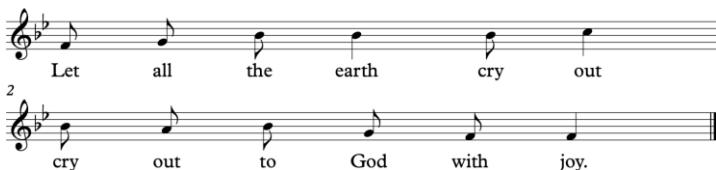
