FROM THE DESK OF FATHER HAGE

During this time of shelter-in-place, I was thinking about how much of a gift it is to have, as a community, a sacred space for worship in our churches. Our churches are filled with so many beautiful images, colors, statues, candles, and sacred art that truly help us lift our minds and hearts up to God in prayer and adoration. Now that visits to our churches have decreased, I would like to encourage all of our parishioners (if you have not already done so) to create a “home altar” in your households. A “home altar” is a very traditional practice whereby families create their own little prayer corner that can be filled with beautiful images, colors, statues, candles, and sacred art. Even as a priest, I find so much consolation in having my own little “home altar” in the rectory. Actually, when I first moved into my rectory that is one of the first things I did was build a “home altar” for myself. These “home altars” or “prayer corners” do have a real impact on the life of faith in the home. We, as human beings, need sights and sounds and images to help deepen our faith and remind us of heavenly things. Especially during this time when we do not know how long we might be at home, I think it would be a tremendous gift to your home to build your own little prayer corner. Here are some things that I think are “home altar” basics:

- A Crucifix
- An Image of Mary, Mother of God
- An image of your favorite saint
- Your favorite Rosary
- A bible left open on the altar
- Prayer cards
- Candles

Just to be clear, the volunteers will not be entering these parishioners' homes for the sake of social distancing. They will simply leave resources/supplies at the person's front door step, and also take every precaution to sanitize.
