New Parish Bible Study!

The next parish Bible Study will take place on Tuesday, November 19. This Bible Study will meet on a monthly basis every third Tuesday of the month from 6:30 to 8pm. Childcare will be provided. In The Eucharist in Scripture, discover God's plan as it is expressed through the Bible and the Mass. This six-lesson study, presented by Dr. Scott Hahn, will unlock the meaning of covenant, sacrifice, and sacrament as understood in the Bible, from Genesis through Revelation.
