New Parish Bible Study!

A new parish Bible Study will begin **this Tuesday, October 15**. This Bible Study will meet on a monthly basis every third Tuesday of the month from 6:30 to 8pm. Childcare will be provided. In The Eucharist in Scripture, discover God's plan as it is expressed through the Bible and the Mass. Built around three of Dr. Hahn's foundational talks: "The Lamb's Supper," "The Fourth Cup," and "Consuming the Word," The Eucharist in Scripture examines the biblical foundations of the Eucharist and explores the Church's liturgy as the original context for the books of the Bible.
